### What's New in 2017?

#### **New Permit Fee Schedule**

Some permit fees were changed as part of the 2017 Dane County Budget. As of January 1, 2017, erosion control disturbed area fees went from \$0.005/ft<sup>2</sup> to \$0.006/ft<sup>2</sup>, and stormwater new and redeveloped impervious area fees went from \$0.010/ft² to \$0.015/ft². #### Chapter 11 Shoreland Ordinance Amendments Coming Soon

Dane County Planning & Development will soon be proposing amendments to Chapter 11 of the Dane County Code of Ordinances in order to bring the County's shoreland zoning ordinance into compliance with recently modified state rules. The changes will clarify the requirements for impervious surface treatment and vegetated buffers. Look for changes to be implemented in the second quarter of 2017.

#### 2017 Plant Dane Native Plant Cost Share Program **COMING SOON!**

The Madison Area Municipal Stormwater Partnership (MAMSWaP) will be accepting orders for its 13th annual Plant Dane Cost Share Program in early February! The Plant Dane Program provides native plants to Dane County residents at half the normal retail price. All schools, nonprofit organizations, municipalities and individual residents of Dane County, WI are eligible. Native plant gardens are an attractive way to reduce lawn-maintenance time and costs, reduce stormwater runoff and beautify your property.

Choose from a variety of native plant species including butterfly, shortgrass prairie, and rain garden kits. Most plants will be \$2.00 each and all species must be ordered in multiples of four. All orders must be placed with full payment by Friday, March 31st, 2017. Participants must pick up plants on Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2017 at Dane County Land and Water Resources 5201 Fen Oak Drive, Madison, WI 53719.
